HELP PROTECT OUR WATER SOURCES

The Columbia Valley Water District would like your assistance in helping us provide you with the best drinking water available. As a reminder, it's imperative that you keep your property clean and avoid storing junk or hulk vehicles on your site. As you are aware, derelict and/or abandoned vehicles can leach unwanted fluids into the ground that can potentially impact your drinking water.

In addition, the Whatcom County Zoning Ordinance, Title 20, (WCC 20.80.541) does not allow for derelict or abandoned vehicles to be parked on private property, public streets, roads, or rights-of-way. Pursuant to WCC 20.94.030, the County may levy fines up to \$1,000.00 per day to any person storing junked and/or abandoned vehicles on their site.

Let's work together to keep our community clean, maintain property values, and more importantly let's work together to eliminate waste materials and pollutants from entering our surface and ground water waters!
