DID I REALLY USE THAT MUCH WATER?

Did you know that most people use an average of 70-90 gallons of water per day? In the average house, two thirds of indoor water is used in the bathroom.

Average Household Use

Toilet	26.7%
Shower	16.8%
Faucet	15.7%
Bath	1.7%
Clothes Washer	21.7%
Dishwasher	1.4%
Leaks	13.7%
Other Domestic	2.2%

Take some time to go through your house and look for ways to conserve. Be sure to check out the District website for useful tips and guides on water conservation.

THINK YOU HAVE A WATER LEAK?

What are the most common sources of a leak?

- ✓ Your toilet may have a silent leak. Drop a little food coloring into the tank. Wait about 10 minutes without flushing. If color appears in the bowl, you have a leak.
- ✓ Check for moist spots around and under the house plumbing and around outdoor plumbing.
- ✓ Replace worn washers in faucets and showerheads. Even a small drip can waste as much as 170 gallons of water each day or 5,000 gallons a month.

Contact the District should you need help verifying that you have a leak, or if you need your water meter turned off to do repairs.
